Session Highlights

- Transparent and good communication throughout the supply chain leads to compliance and business sustainability. There is a strong need for systems and tools that facilitate and streamline the communication and transfer of information. By ensuring REACH compliance throughout the supply chain, the companies can better manage risks posed by complex chemicals in products. Inclusion of a substance in the Candidate List is not a “ban”, however companies should consider substitution of Candidate List substances in the articles. The substitution can only be achieved once companies are aware of the chemicals being used.
- Engaging in an open dialogue about companies’ experiences in the use of supply chain communication tools regarding specific elements will allow increasing benefits for all stakeholders across the supply chain.
- The industry understands that quality and sustainability are not a cost factor these are important steps which are increasingly considered as an investment in a better future.
- Constructive dialogue between different political, social and economic actors helps to reduce the complexity and gaps that are present today in the supply chains.
