

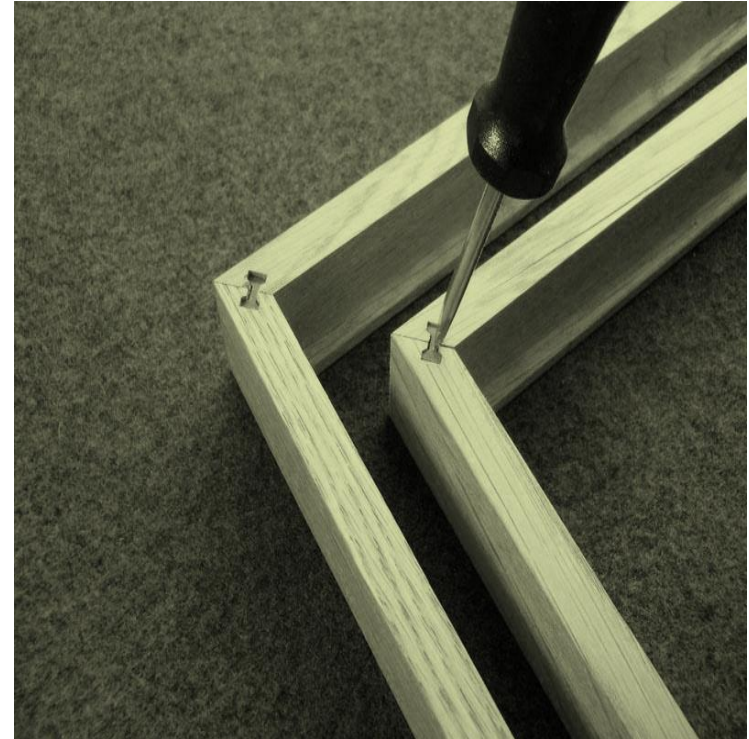
17 global goals for sustainable development- interlinked and interdependent
